

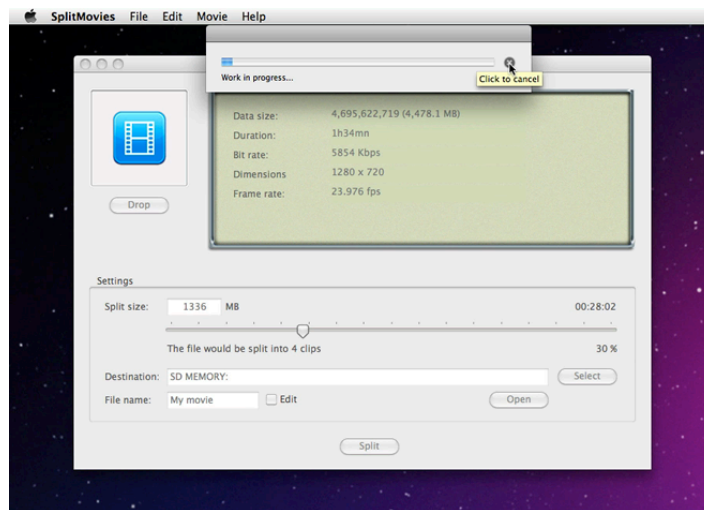
SplitMovies

1. Introduction

SplitMovies is a Mac application that will allow the user to split movie files into multiple independent video clips, each of which can be opened and played back. Currently, SplitMovies supports three main media formats for imports: QuickTime (3GP, 3GP2, DV, M4V, MOV, MP4), Matroska (MKV) and AVI.

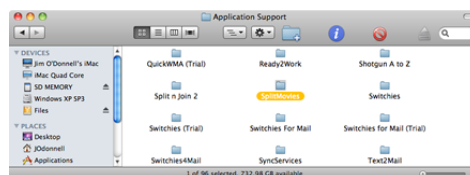


2. Installing SplitMovies

You can give it its own folder if you like, or just drag and drop a copy of SplitMovies anywhere even inside a USB drive. And you are all set. If you have installed and used a beta/demo/trial version of SplitMovies, it is not necessary that you delete the application. The full version can coexist with it.

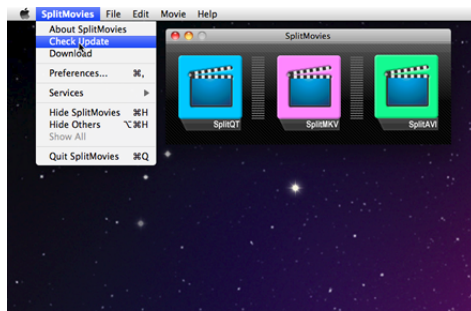
3. Uninstalling SplitMovies

When launched for the first time, SplitMovies creates a folder containing several files inside the Application Support folder, which you need to trash on top of the application file itself.



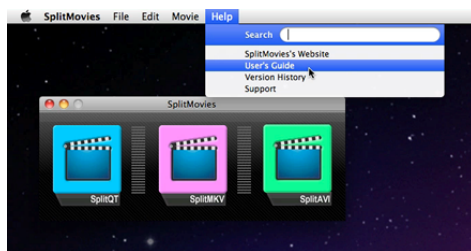
4. Updating SplitMovies

None of our software products supports an automatic update feature for the security reason. SplitMovies is not an exception. In the meantime, find **Check Update** under the SplitMovies menu to see if there are newer versions available. You can also enable **Run update notification** in Preferences to let the application to do the job automatically every time you launch SplitMovies. If a message says there are, then choose **Download** to go to our website to download the latest version. You need to log in at first. Please refer to the e-mail message titled **SplitMovies License** for login information. After downloading the latest update, just replace an existing application file with a new one.
