

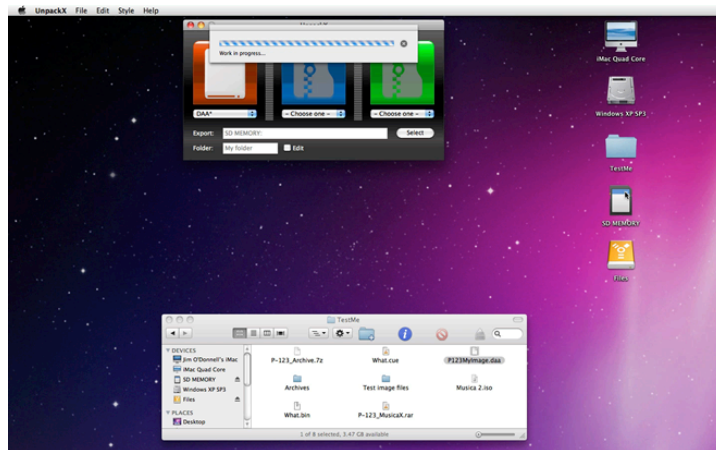
UnpackX



Thank you for your using UnpackX.

1. Introduction

UnpackX is a little Mac application that will let you unpack disc images and file archives into folders. The supported formats are 7Z, BIN, DAA, ISO, RAR, RAR parts. As for 7Z, DAA and RAR (not RAR parts), UnpackX can work on password-protected files.

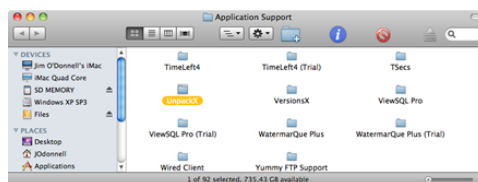


2. Installing UnpackX

You can give it its own folder if you like, or just drag and drop a copy of UnpackX anywhere even inside a USB drive. And you are all set. If you have installed and used the trial version of UnpackX, it is not necessary that you delete the application. You can also keep the trial version of UnpackX if you have it though we recommend that you trash it with its application data folder.

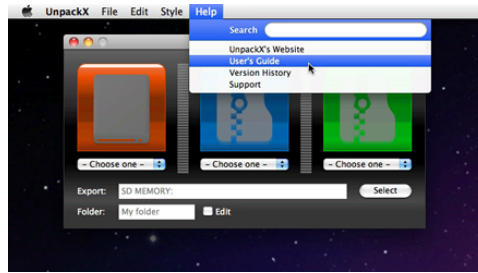
3. Uninstalling UnpackX

When launched for the first time, UnpackX creates a folder containing several files inside the Application Support folder, which you need to trash on top of the application file itself. You can easily locate this folder by opening **Preferences** and switching tabs to **System files**.
